# MINUTES ASHE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION May 6, 2019

The meeting was held as scheduled with all members present. Chairman Jones called the meeting to order, welcomed those in attendance and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Following a presentation by AIG Director Sandra Peterson and the AIG Specialists, a motion by Mrs. Jones and a second by Mr. McClure gave unanimous approval to the Ashe County Schools Local Academically or Intellectually Gifted (AIG) Plan effective 2019-2022. This plan will now be submitted to the Department of Public Instruction as required.

Members of the Board of Directors for the School-Based Health Center Top Dog Clinic—Director of Clinical Services Kelly Welsh and Director Jennifer Greene, AppHealthCare, and Chairman David Blackburn, Ashe Baptist Association—along with employees from the Top Dog Clinic gave its yearly presentation on the

Clinic. The purpose of the Clinic is to foster a healthy student community by providing accessible quality care to influence health habits and behaviors which promote the development of young minds and bodies. The Clinic is staffed by a family nurse practitioner, an expanded role child heath registered nurse, a certified nursing assistant/medical assistant and a dually licensed clinical social worker and clinical addiction specialist. This current year, 85 percent of the middle school population (413 students) have enrolled for services. Over 1,000 clinic visits were provided—23 percent of these visits were to address mental health needs. Sadly, mental health needs for youth are increasing nationwide. The group highlighted the benefits that the Top Dog Clinic provides for students, teachers and parents. The partnership between Ashe County, Ashe County Schools in-kind contributions and AppHealthCare provides the annual funding for the Clinic.

Following a presentation by Student Services Director Jamie Little, a motion by Mrs. Eldreth and a second by Mr. McClure gave unanimous approval to renewal of the Contract for School-Based Mental Health Services between Appalachian State University and Ashe County Schools for Counseling Services through the Assessment, Support and Counseling Center (ASC) for the 2019/20 school year. It is worthy to note that since the program was first launched in 2011, the Ashe County Schools/ASC Center Partnership has served numerous students and families in need of mental health treatment at no cost to them.

Human Resources Director Lesia Goodman presented the 2019/20 teacher contract recommendations to the Board for its consideration and review. Action will be taken at the regular meeting for June.

Mrs. Goodman presented the 2019/20 administrative contract recommendation to the Board for its consideration and review. Action will be taken at the regular meeting in June as well.

Finance Officer Amanda Coldiron asked the Board to consider adopting Policy 7650 *Travel* as required to meet the Federal 2CRF Part 200.474(a) and 200.474(b) guidelines. Pursuant to Board policy, action will be taken at the regular meeting in June.

The Superintendent commented on the following.
