To Schedule an Appointment

Applications for the Ashe County 2025-2026 NC Pre-K Program will be available starting February 7, 2025. These are available on the Ashe County Schools website or at our Ashe Co. NC Pre-K office – Ashe Early Learning Center, 406 School Ave., West Jefferson, NC 28694. Applications will also be available at any Ashe County NC Pre-K Site and the Partnership of Ashe.

All students applying for NC Pre-K must turn 4 years old on or before August 31, 2025.

The following documents will be needed to complete the application process and allow us to conduct the required DIAL screening:

1 – Completed application

2 – Child's certified birth certificate or adoption decree

3 – Proof of Income (2024 Tax Return, W-2's, 4 current, consecutive check stubs or signed and dated letter from employer with hours and rate of pay, SSI Statement, Social Security Wages/Benefits Statement, Disability Payment Info., Child Support Info., Direct Sales Income, Veteran Services Benefits, etc.)

4 – Proof of Residence in Ashe County

Your child cannot be screened unless the application is completed and necessary documentation is provided at the time of your arrival.

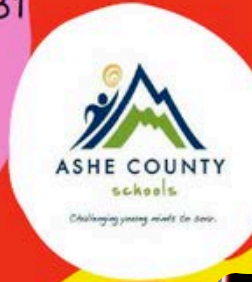

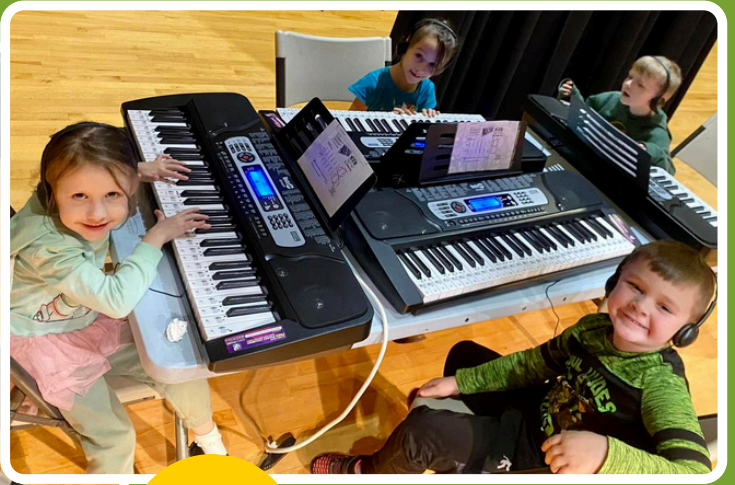
